

TUTORIAL ASSIGNMENT

READING: Mark 1:9-11; Matt 3:13-17; Luke 3:21-2; John 1:29-34

ASSIGNMENT:

Two problems are the focus of this exercise. One is the literary relationship between the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke). The other is the problem of identifying exactly who Jesus was, what he said and he did historically. To help focus on the problem answer the following questions related to an event known traditionally as “The Baptism of Jesus”. You may use the table below to help you but for questions 4 and 5 *you must consult the actual gospels themselves and read them in the New Testament.*

Read the Synoptic accounts first (Mark 1:9-11; Matt 3:13-17; Luke 3:21-2)

1. What details are the same?
2. What differences do you notice? Read very carefully.
3. Now add John’s account (John 1:29-34). How is it very different?
4. What is the context for each of these four scenes? In other words, what specific events happen just before and right after the baptism in each gospel?
5. Identify the three most significant differences that you notice and explain why they are different? Offer the best explanation that you can with regard to these differences — this is the most important part of the assignment.
